Definitions

- <u>"Number of Students Who Began the Program"</u> means the number of students who began a program who were scheduled to complete the program within 100% of the published program length within the reporting calendar year and excludes all students who cancelled during the cancellation period.
- <u>"Students Available for Graduation"</u> is the number of students who began the program minus the number of students who have died, been incarcerated, or been called to active military duty.
- <u>"Number of On-time Graduates"</u> is the number of students who completed the program within 100% of the published program length within the reporting calendar year.
- <u>"On-time Completion Rate"</u> is the number of on-time graduates divided by the number of students available for graduation.
- <u>"150% Graduates"</u> is the number of students who completed the program within 150% of the program length (includes on-time graduates).
- <u>"150% Completion Rate"</u> is the number of students who completed the program in the reported calendar year within 150% of the published program length, including on-time graduates, divided by the number of students available for graduation.
- <u>"Graduates Available for Employment"</u> means the number of graduates minus the number of graduates unavailable for employment.
- <u>"Graduates Unavailable for Employment"</u> means the graduates who, after graduation, die, become incarcerated, are called to active military duty, are international students that leave the United States or do not have a visa allowing employment in the United States, or are continuing their education in an accredited or bureau-approved postsecondary institution.
- "Graduates Employed in the Field" means graduates who beginning within six months after a student completes the applicable educational program are gainfully employed, whose employment has been reported, and for whom the institution has documented verification of employment. For occupations for which the state requires passing an examination, the six months period begins after the announcement of the examination results for the first examination available after a student completes an applicable educational program.
- <u>"Placement Rate Employed in the Field"</u> is calculated by dividing the number of graduates gainfully employed in the field by the number of graduates available for employment.
- <u>"Number of Graduates Taking Exam"</u> is the number of graduates who took the first available exam in the reported calendar year.

STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL

A Student may cancel this agreement at anytime by notifying the School in writing (a **"NOTICE OF CANCELLATION"** is provided).

After this 100 percent refund cancellation period has passed, the refund to be paid to a student shall be calculated by deducting the registration and STRF fees from the program's total charges for a period of attendance and dividing this figure by the total number of program's clock hours. The quotient is the hourly charge for the instruction. The amount of monies owed by the student for the purpose of calculating a refund is derived by multiplying the total hours the student had attended by the hourly charge for instruction. The amount of the refund to which a student would be entitled (after completing a period of days or weeks of instruction) will be calculated by deducting both the amount monies owed by the students and the non-refundable fees (registration and STRF) from the total charges of the program for the period of attendance. There will be no tuition refund for students who have completed 60 percent and more of the period of attendance of the program. The institution will pay or credit refunds within 45 days of a student's cancellation or withdrawal.

You have the right to withdraw from a course of institution at any time. If you withdraw from the course of institution after the period allowed for cancellation of the agreement, which is until the fifth day of class session, or the seventh (7) calendar day after enrollment, whichever is later, the school will remit a refund less a registration fee, if applicable, within 30 days following your withdraw. You are obligated to pay only for educational services rendered and for unreturned equipment. IF THE AMOUNT YOU HAVE PAID IS MORE THAN THE AMOUNT YOU OWE FOR TIME YOU ATTENDED, THEN A REFUND WILL BE MADE WITHIN 30 DAYS OF WITHDRAWAL. IF THE AMOUNT YOU OWE IS MORE THAN THE AMOUNT YOU HAVE ALREADY PAY, THEN WILL HAVE TO MAKE ARRANGEMENTS TO PAY IT. Refund, if any due according to PRO BARBER COLLEGE, INC.
